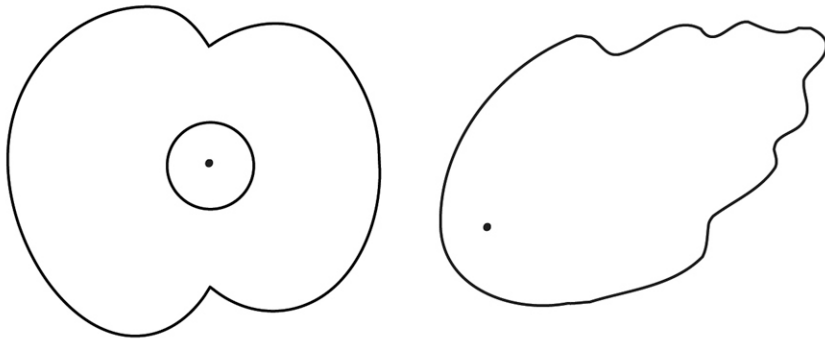


Remembrance Day Poppies To Make

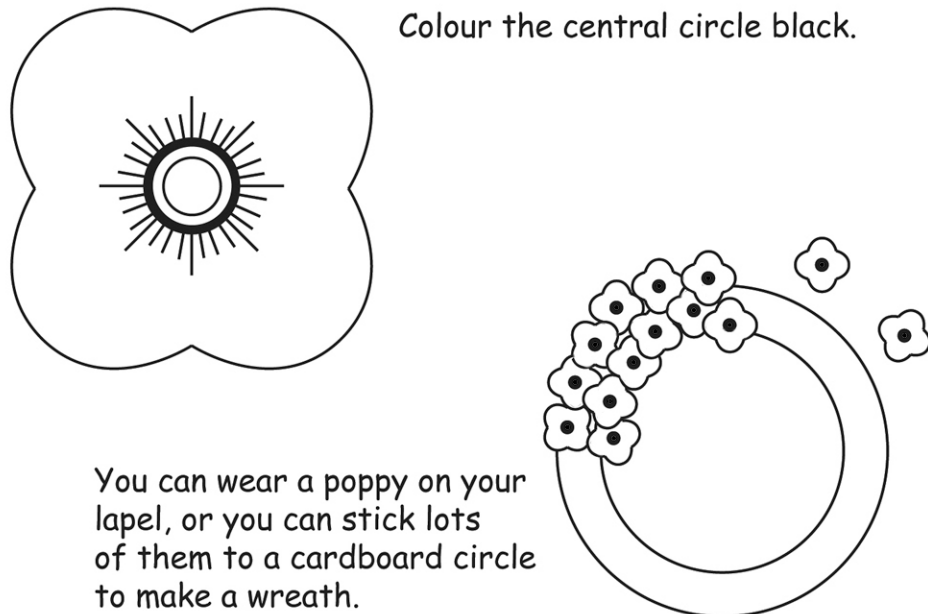
Colour and cut out the poppies and leaf. Attach the leaf behind the first poppy, with the dots matching.



This type of poppy is usually worn 'South of the Border'



This type of poppy is usually worn 'North of the Border'



Colour the central circle black.

You can wear a poppy on your lapel, or you can stick lots of them to a cardboard circle to make a wreath.

During November, poppies may be worn.

They are to remind us of all the people who fought and died in World War I and II and wars since then.

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month a treaty was signed to end World War I.

Now we call this day Remembrance Day. The second Sunday of November is called Remembrance Sunday. On this day there are special ceremonies at churches and war memorials and at 11am there is a two-minute silence.
